TOPCLIFFE VILLAGE TIDY-UP DAY SATURDAY 18TH SEPTEMBER — YOUR HELP NEEDED

Following on from the success of the village litter pick last Autumn Topcliffe Parish Councillors are organising a village 'Tidy-up' day on Saturday 18th September. They are looking for volunteers to come along and help with a general tidy up of the village. We are meeting at 2pm at the village cross, outside the Post Office and plan to spend no more than 3 hours tidying up. If you would like to help to improve the appearance of **your** village please come along — you will be more than welcome. With plenty of willing helpers it should not take too long to pick up the litter, tidy the verges and generally make Topcliffe look a little neater. Please make sure you bring some personal protection such as gloves etc. You don't have to stay for the whole period. Whatever time you can spend will be appreciated. If you can't come along how about just tidying up the piece of

street immediately outside your house. It wouldn't take you more than 15 minutes. If every household did that the village would look so much tidier.

NEW RE-CYCLING SITE FOR TOPCLIFFE

The Parish Councillors have been busy trying to find a suitable site for positioning re-cycling bins. This has been easier said than done! Eventually it was decided that the lay-by just on the Dalton Road turning may be suitable. This site will be trialled for 3 months with re-cycling bins sited there in the next few weeks (hopefully). If successful the site will become permanent and may be resurfaced with screening provided. The site will be much easier to use than having to go all the way into Thirsk.

Please use it otherwise we will lose it!

EDITORIAL

KEEPING THE GUTTERS CLEAN

In the last issue of the TATtler, the Topcliffe Parish Council report contained a few lines requesting residents to help improve the appearance of the village by keeping the gutter-ways clean in areas not subject to roadside cleaning.

The weeds have had a great time this summer, especially with the recent rain, and there are many parts of the village where they are flourishing in the gutter-ways. As the council noted, it only takes a few minutes to put things right, and at the same time it gives the area a cared for appearance.

There is an added advantage if the roads are about to be resurfaced. Some of you may remember the national press carrying an article a



year or so ago, about a white-lining crew who continued their line around the dead badger lying at the roadside. Clearly the same mentality exists with some of the road resurfacing teams! The road from the Swale Bridge to Asenby has recently been

resurfaced and some of you may have noticed that tar and chippings have been liberally sprayed on the soil, leaves and weeds in the bridge gutter-ways. As the accompanying photograph shows, the weeds are still doing well despite this treatment!

Clearly, we cannot expect our respective councils to do everything necessary to keep the place tidy, and from time to time we have to do a bit ourselves.

Topcliffe PC are planning a village "tidy-up" day on Saturday September 18th so hopefully there will be a good turn-out of helpers like last year, and we can all do our bit to improve the appearance of the village.

TOPCLIFFE SURGERY

SATURDAY MORNINGS AND OUT-OF-HOURS

From 1 October 2004, Topcliffe Surgery will no longer be open on Saturday mornings for either emergency consultations or ordering and collection of prescriptions. This change is part of the government's new contract with GPs and affects surgeries all over the country. Out-of-hours services will be extended to include Saturday mornings.


Out-of-hours services have, since 1997, been provided by North Yorkshire Emergency Doctors (NYED) which is a cooperative of

local GPs. The government's new contract also means that responsibility for out-of-hours will transfer to Hambleton and Richmondshire Primary Care Trust on 1 October. As they have chosen to use NYED, patients should not notice any change in out-of-hours services.

Surgeries during the week will continue as at present. As we usually operate a combination of walk-in surgeries and appointments, during the week patients can still see a doctor or

nurse on the day of their choice.

Please remember that the Surgery will be closed on Saturday when ordering and collecting prescriptions. To collect prescriptions on a Monday morning, prescriptions need to have been ordered by 12.30 pm Thursday lunchtime.



THE MILLENNIUM BOOK OF TOPCLIFFE

People keep asking if there are any copies of the Millennium Book of Topcliffe left. UPDATE ON TOLL BOOTH PROJECT AND YOUTH ENGAGEMENT PROJECT

Modernisation of the ground floor of the Toll Booth continues. As might be expected, there has been considerable delay in progressing the upgrade of electricity supplies due to the need to obtain listed building planning consent. However, this is now with the local authority and is being pursued in conjunction with changes to windows to provide better security and weather proofing. The internal vertical timbers have been treated and brought back to life and plan drawings for creating the intranet have been done. Despite these minor setbacks which can be frustrating for some, the building is still being well used by the village youth.

As part of the plan to widen engagement, it is proposed to seek sponsorship from individuals and organisations whose names will be recorded for posterity on a benefactors board and who will be invited to participate in a subsequent publicity. Heading the list will be Dr Shaw and Dr Parker whose generous donation has helped stimulate and provide confidence in this project. POLICE PHONE NUMBERS

When the 'Cop Shop' opened in Thirsk at the beginning of the year, we reported that the telephone number of the new office was 01609 789737, but that this 'phone would only be answered during office hours, 11 am to 7 pm, Monday to Saturday inclusive.

The TATtler has since learned that residents have had difficulty in getting through to this number and often end up listening to an answering machine. After making enquiries we have been advised that the Police preferred number for non-emergencies is **01609 783131**, which should put you through to the Control Room at Newby Wiske. However, at busy times, *you could wait for up to 20 minutes before getting a reply.*

Many of us do not wish to call 999, but do need to speak to the Police on a fairly urgent basis, particularly if we are concerned about bogus callers in the area. However, a twenty minute wait could well be too long, and it seems that in many cases there may be little option other than to call 999. The choice is yours!

CHURCH FUNDRAISERS

Two concerts at St. Columba's for your diary.

At 8.00pm on Tuesday 28th September, the long awaited Hermitage Ensemble from St. Petersburg, Russia, will be appearing. This male voice ensemble will present a concert of unaccompanied music, including sacred Orthodox hymns and Russian folk songs.

Founded in 1994, this group of professional singers perform as soloists at the Opera and Philharmonic in St. Petersburg and also sing in church choirs. They have recently toured in Germany, Denmark and Switzerland as well as the U.K.

CHURCH TOWER NEWS

Back in March TATtler reported that the Church Tower work should be completed by early July, 2004, and here we are in early September and it still looks as though there's a bit of work to finish.

Well progress is being made but it's slow and there have been some unforeseeable delays. Most of the remaining work is on the pinnacles, which as many of you will have noted, are slowly being put in place. Clearly the wet & windy weather did not help in August, (although this did not delay progress) but an earlier

problem with "shallow beds" at the quarry, meant that the large pieces of stone required for the pinnacles were simply not there to be quarried. Eventually, as quarrying progressed, larger pieces of stone became available and work could continue, but each piece of stone has to be transported to Rugby for cutting and carving and it all takes time. Just to make matters worse, the carver broke his wrist!

So when will it be finished? Well, possibly by the end of September, but we certainly hope that the December edition of the TATtler can report that all the work is complete!

One unexpected contribution for the tower restoration recently came from Topcliffe Show. The last show was held at Baldersby Park in July 1967. There was a little money left in the kitty when the books were balanced and this has been languishing in a bank account ever since. The money has now been donated to the Clock Fund which is now healthier to the tune of £155.56. A most welcome gift!
